We show love to each other through small acts of kindness and through encouraging others with kind words, remembering that God loves us and we can love ourselves and others. We will let our love shine every day.

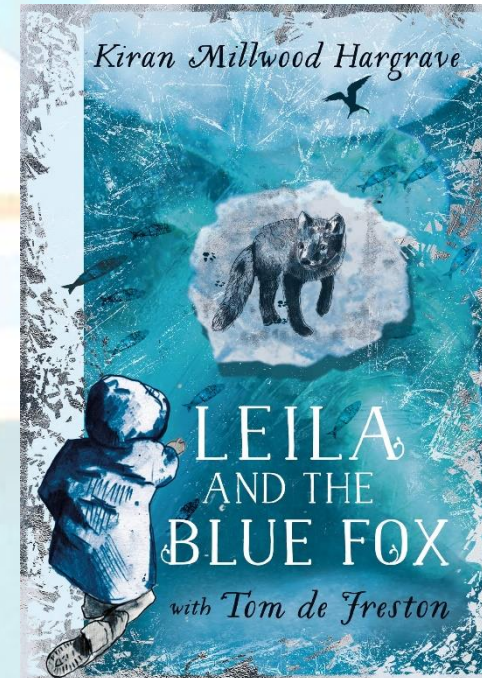
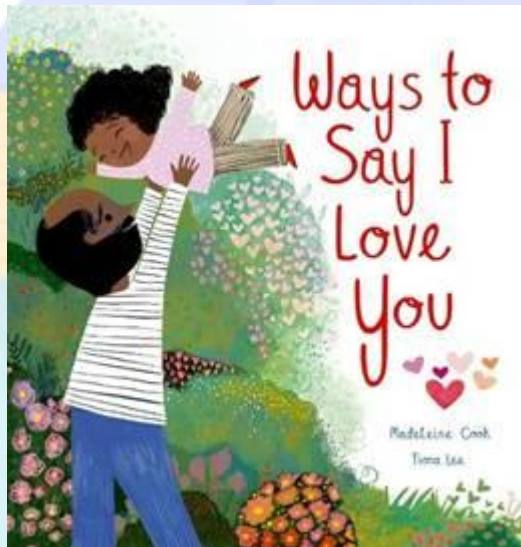
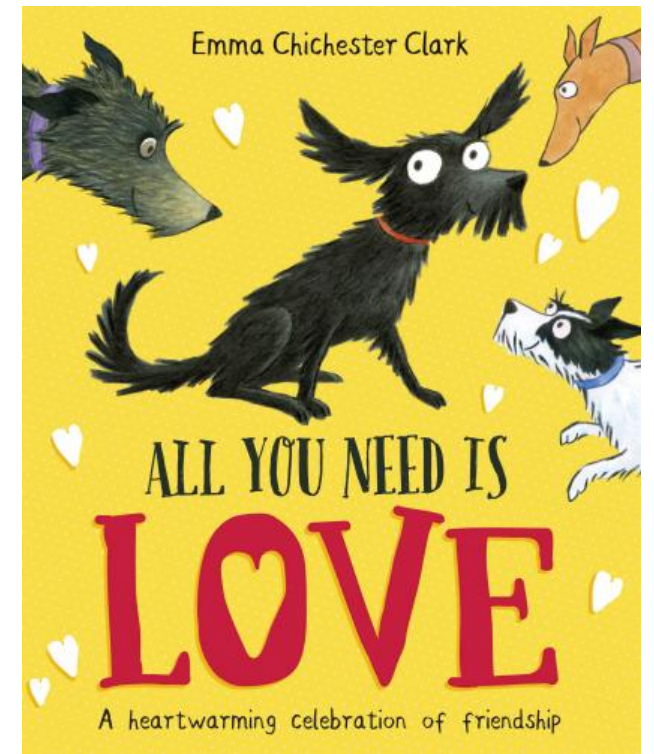
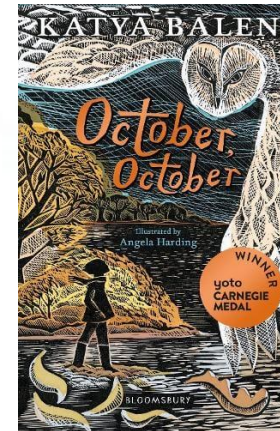
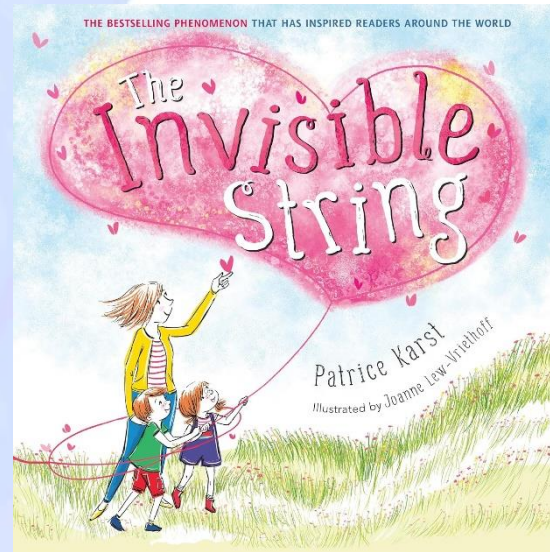
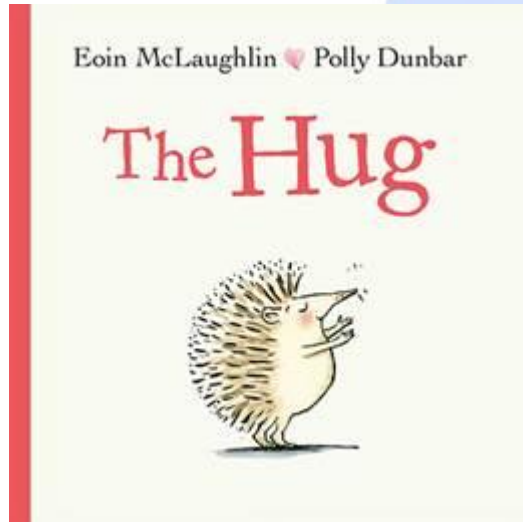


Love in the bible

Compassion at Wroxton

Each week, children within our school will be celebrated for being great role models for showing compassion and examples of how they have done this will be shared with the whole school in our Celebration Worship.



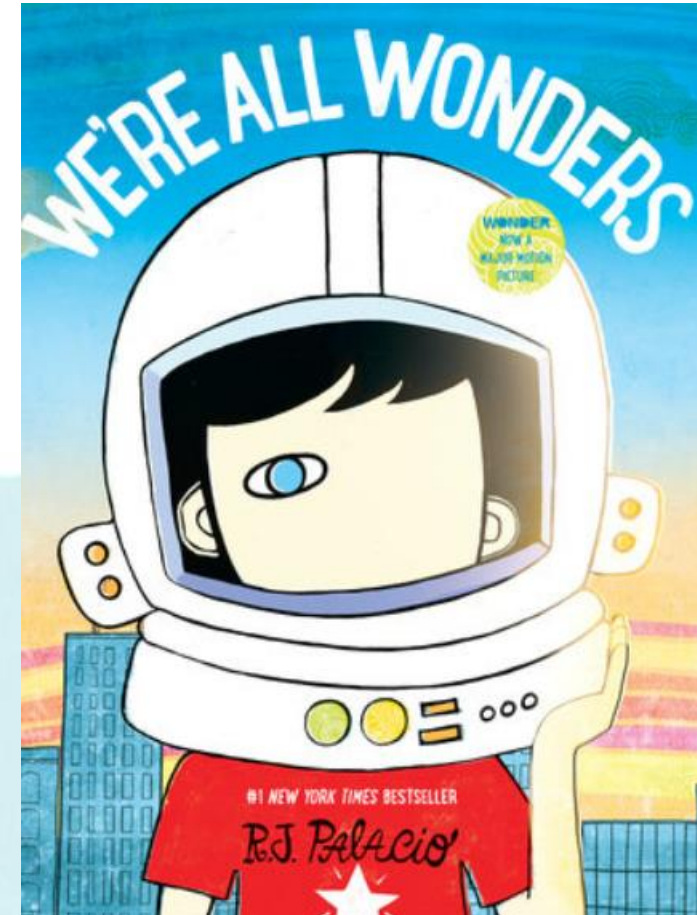
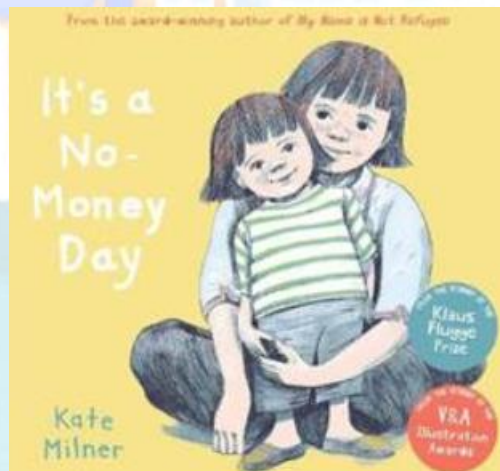
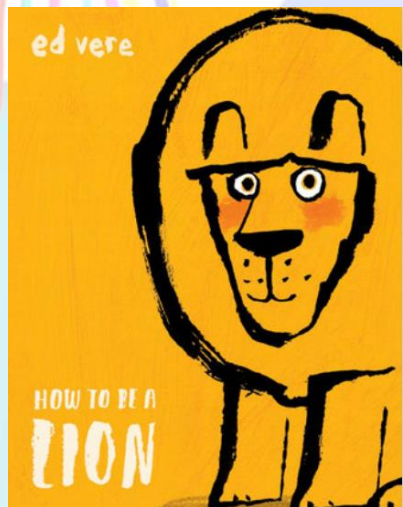
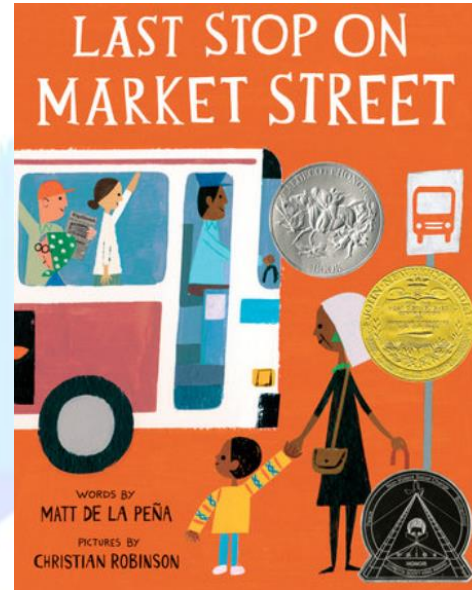
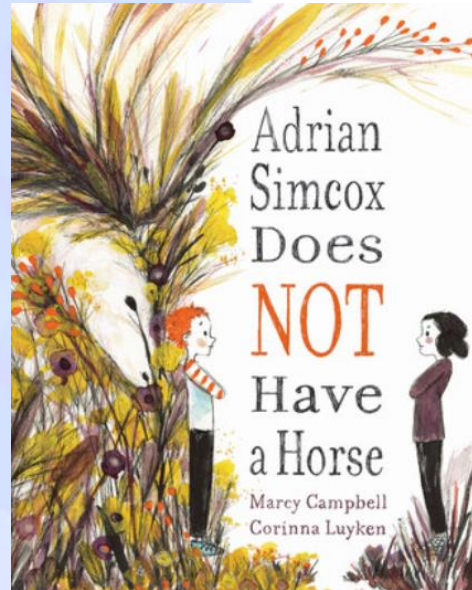
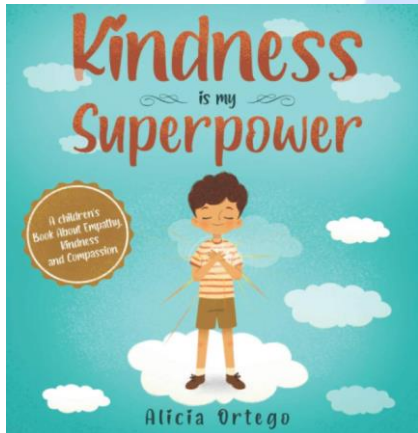
Compassion in the bible

The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37): This parable teaches children that everyone is their neighbour and that we should show kindness to anyone in need, no matter who they are.

Jesus Heals the Sick (Matthew 14:13-14): Jesus shows compassion to the crowd by healing the sick and feeding them when they were hungry.

Feeding the 5,000 (John 6:1-14): Jesus saw the people were hungry and had compassion, so He performed a miracle to provide for them.

Courage



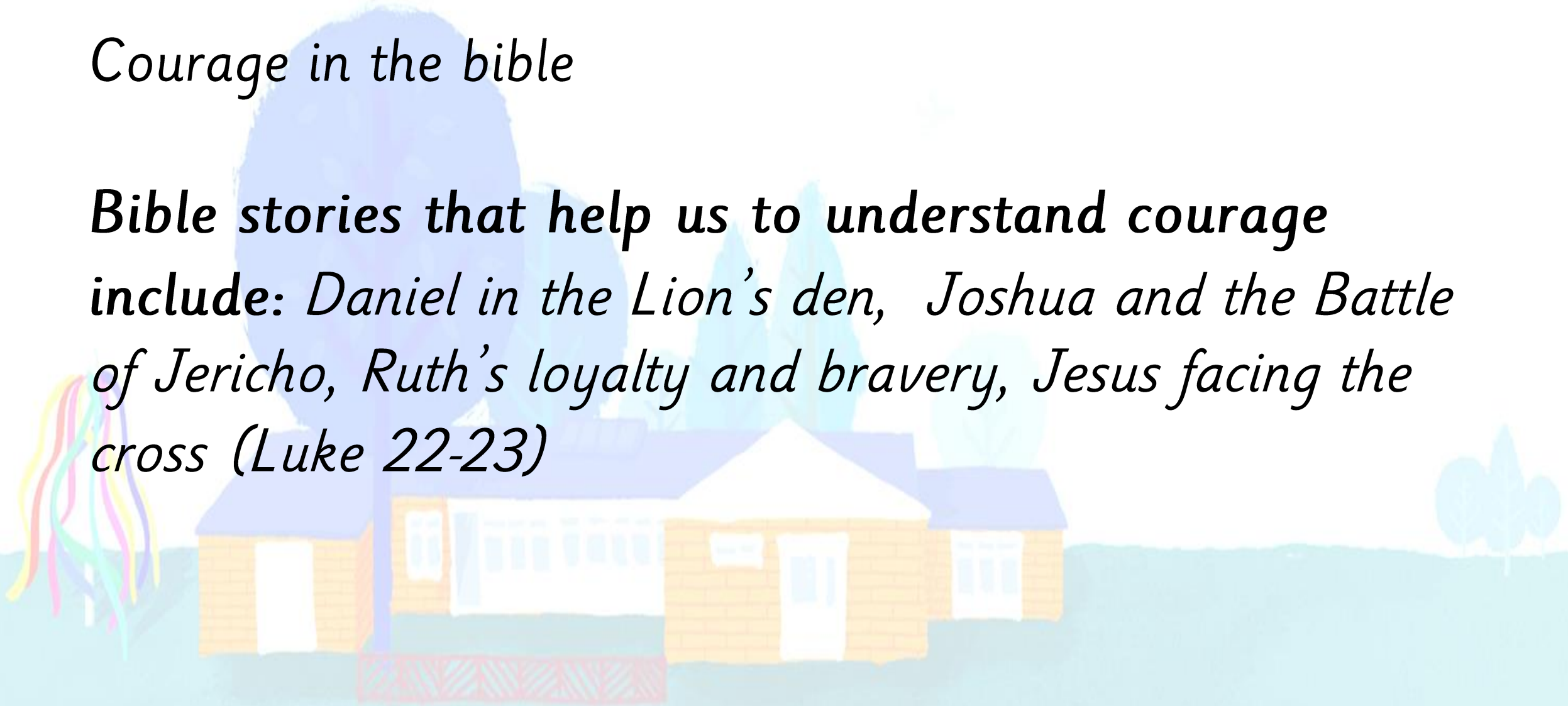
Courage is an important value because it enables us to try new things and experiences and know that by doing so, we can meet our learning goals.
